UNIT 3. ACCIDENTS OR INJURIES

INTRODUCTION

Unit 3 explores the theme of accidents and injuries, helping students understand and describe unexpected events that occur in everyday life. This unit focuses on developing the ability to narrate past situations clearly and accurately, using language that reflects how people naturally talk about emergencies, mishaps, or surprising moments. Through real life examples and practical vocabulary, students learn to recognize the difference between background actions and main events—an essential skill when telling stories or explaining what happened.

A central component of this unit is the past continuous tense, a structure used to describe actions in progress at a specific moment in the past. Students analyze how this tense interacts with the simple past to explain sequences, interruptions, and cause and effect situations. For example: *“I was walking to school when I slipped.”* These patterns help learners organize information logically and communicate more fluently when recounting incidents.

Finally, the unit provides opportunities to understand spoken descriptions of accidents—such as reports, eyewitness accounts, or personal stories—and to read a short article about a dramatic event. These activities encourage learners to identify key details, interpret tone, and practice explaining events with clarity and confidence. By the end of the unit, students will be able to describe incidents, understand narrated events, and use past tense structures effectively in real world communication.

OBJECTIVE

Strengthen students’ ability to narrate past events clearly and accurately using the past continuous and simple past. Students will understand spoken and written descriptions of accidents or unexpected situations, identify key details in dramatic events, and produce coherent oral and written narratives that reflect real life communication. By the end of the unit, learners will confidently describe sequences of events, explain what was happening at specific moments in the past, and interpret authentic accounts related to accidents and injuries.
