INTRODUCTION TO THE UNIT 2

This unit focuses on developing students' abilities to interact in real-life situations by asking and answering questions about ongoing actions and past activities. Learners will also practice showing active listening, expressing emotions such as surprise, and discussing daily events, which will allow them to engage confidently in meaningful conversations in English.

UNIT OBJECTIVE

By the end of this unit, students will be able to use English to describe what people are doing at the moment, talk about recent and past experiences, explain situations when they cannot talk, demonstrate listening skills, express surprise, and share information about routine and special activities in the past, in order to improve their fluency and interaction in everyday communication.
